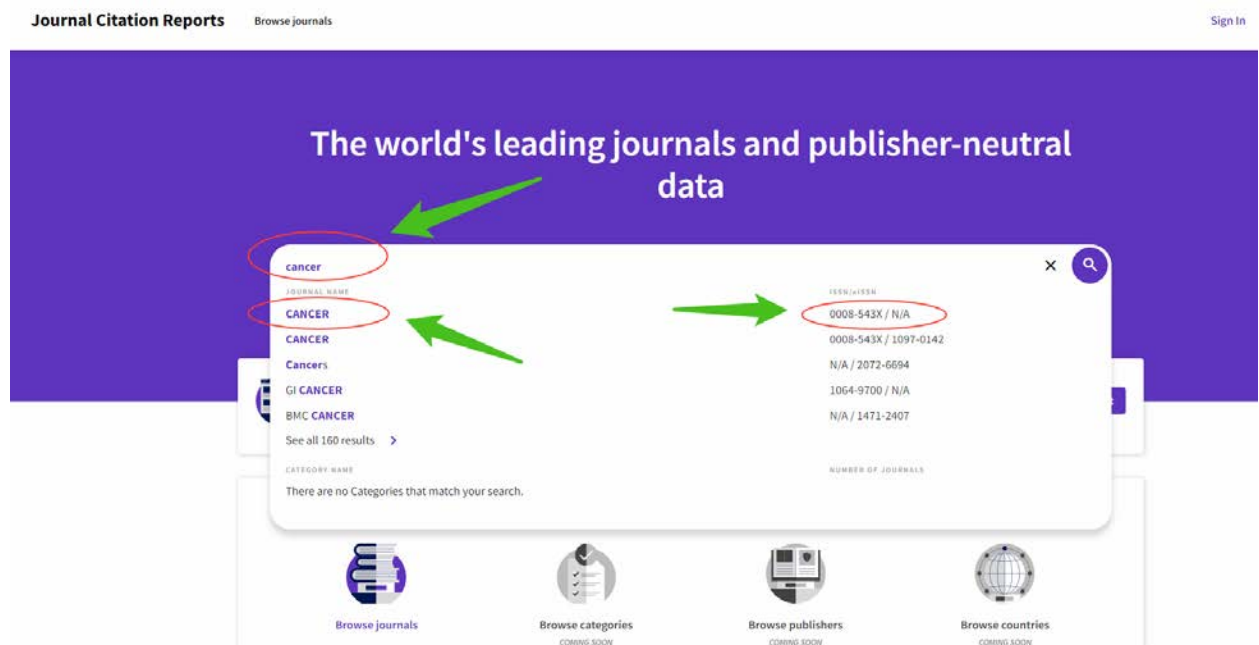


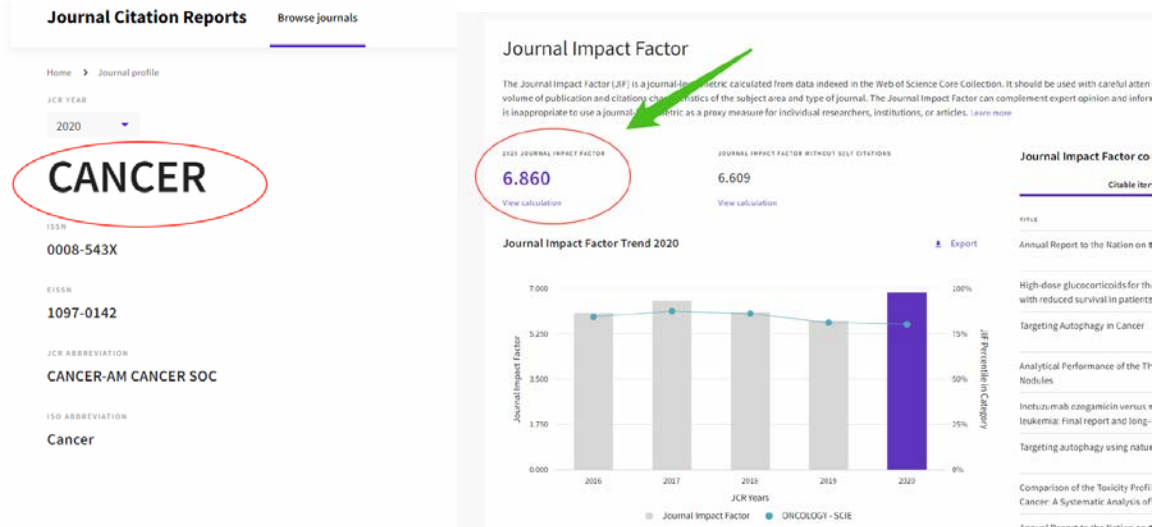
How to Lookup Impact Factors and Quartile Rankings for Journals/Publications:

- Navigate to <https://library.moffitt.org/databases>.
- Search for “Journal Citation Reports” via the database search box on the left-hand side of the webpage.
- Click on Journal Citation Report (Impact Factors) and then sign-in with your Moffitt Credentials.
- Or you can use the direct link: <https://jcr-clarivate-com.moffitt.idm.oclc.org/> and sign-in with your credentials.
- Now you’re in Journal Citation Reports; type in the journal title for the article in question. As you’re typing in the journal name, a dropdown will initiate with possible journal title matches. Choose the journal that matches.
 - You can also search by journal ISSN.



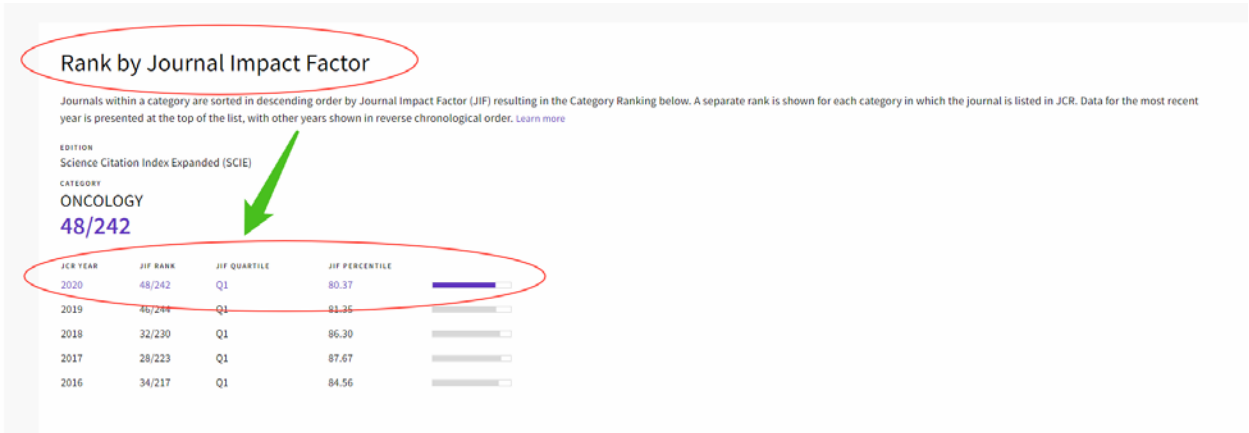
- There are a couple things to keep in mind when searching for journals:
 - There may be multiple journals with the same or similar titles; be sure to verify you have the right journal by checking the ISSN in the search box or on the journal record page.
 - Some journals are not indexed in Journal Citation Reports and therefore do not have an Impact Factor or Quartile Ranking(s); if no results are given for the journal title, make sure you have entered in the journal title exactly, but it is entirely possible that the journal is not in the database!

- Once you click on the desired journal in the dropdown, it will take you to the journal record:



- The journal title information is at the top of the page. Scroll down to find the Impact Factor next. 2020 is the most current year of Impact Factors right now.

- To find quartile ranking information, scroll down the page:



- A couple things to keep in mind when looking at quartile ranking information:
 - The 2020 ranking is the most current ranking.
 - Some journals have multiple quartile rankings because they may fall in more than one category. This journal only has one category, "Oncology," but another journal could be in "Oncology" and "Microbiology;" then there would be two quartile rankings listed.
 - Many users go with just one quartile ranking that is the highest quartile out of all the categories for the journal. It is also ok to list multiple quartiles (it is your choice on whether to list the categories, as well).
