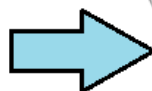

Importing Citations from Google Scholar

1. In Google Scholar you can only download citations one at a time.
2. Find the citation you would like to download
3. **Click Cite > Select EndNote > Save Temporary File to Computer**
